### **December 22<sup>nd</sup> 2015**

Police received a 911 call to a motor vehicle accident on Thornhill Street and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street in Morden. A vehicle was travelling east bound in the curb lane when a second vehicle pulling a trailer was travelling in the median lane. The vehicle in the median lane failed to see the other vehicle and began to merge into the curb lane coming in contact with the other vehicle and pushing it into the curb. One driver was assessed at the scene by paramedics and released.

Police are continuing their investigation.

A man, currently on an order to abstain from communicating directly or indirectly with his wife, attended the Morden Provincial Court office for his court date. The accused decided to tempt fate by bringing his wife to court with him and sitting with her in the court room gallery. Police were called to deal with the blatant breach of the man's undertaking where he was arrested and removed from the court room. The accused was issued a Promise to Appear in Morden Provincial Court in January and reminded that the conditions of the current order remain in effect until his charges are dealt with in court. The 54 year old Winkler resident will be appearing in court in January on his new charge for breaching his undertaking.

### **December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police are investigating a historical sexual assault that took place over 20 years ago. A decision will be made regarding charges once the investigation is complete.

### **December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a 911 call of a motor vehicle accident at the corner of Thornhill Street and 1<sup>st</sup> Street in Morden. A vehicle was travelling north bound on Route 100 approaching a red light. The driver tried to stop but slid into the intersection striking an eastbound vehicle. There were no injuries as a result of the accident but vehicles requiring towing from the scene.

### **December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Around 6:30 pm, a call was received of a 2004 Jeep Liberty stolen from in front of the Subway Restaurant in Morden. The victim arrived at Subway and parked directly in front of the doors, left the vehicle running, and went inside to place an order. She returned approximately 2 minutes later and noticed her vehicle was gone. She waited for a few minutes thinking someone was playing a prank, but realized it was not returning. Through investigation, police determined a possible suspect and began to check on his whereabouts. It was learned that the suspect did in fact have the vehicle in Winnipeg and would be returning to the area in the next few days. Information was received that the suspect would be returning to Winkler Sunday, December 20<sup>th</sup>. Winkler Police Service was notified to be on the lookout for this stolen vehicle and on December 20<sup>th</sup> at around 2:30 pm, the vehicle was spotted and eventually stopped. The 20 year old Morden resident is charged with Flight from Police, Drive Prohibited, Theft of Motor Vehicle, 2 counts of Possess Goods obtained by Crime and 2 counts of Breach of Probation. He is being held in custody and appearing in court on January 21<sup>st</sup>.

### **December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

It was later determined that the suspect entered other banking institutions in other communities in the area attempting to commit the same act. Police are coordinating with other agencies in this investigation.

**December 9<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Two youth, ages 16 and 17, were issued warnings for their driving after a complaint was received. A parent was by Maple Leaf School in Morden dropping off his children and observed two vehicles spinning around the corner and parking on 10<sup>th</sup> Street. Police spoke with the two drivers and questioned each on their driving habits. The parent was satisfied with the youth receiving writing warnings for imprudent driving.

### **December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a Provincial 911 call of a single vehicle rollover accident on Willcocks Road and Road 28. Police attended and observed a vehicle on its roof in the north ditch of the intersection. Morden Fire & Rescue were on scene along with occupants of the vehicle. The driver was travelling north on Road 28 approaching the intersection of Willcocks Road. Due to extremely icy conditions, the driver was unable to stop and slid off the end of the roadway. The driver and 3 young children in the vehicle were not hurt and did not require medical attention.

### **December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police have a Warrant for Arrest for 26 year old Eric Devell Johnson of Morden for failing to attend court on December 10th. Johnson was convicted on charges of theft under \$5000.00 in 2008 and placed on probation. Johnson failed to comply with conditions of the order and was subsequently arrested and compelled to attend court which he failed to do. A check through police dispatch revealed that the license plates were actually reported stolen as well as the driver being disqualified from driving. Additionally, he was served with Provincial Offence Notices for drive without motor vehicle liability insurance, attach unauthorized number plates and drive disqualified. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

### **December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

A 23 year old male spent the night in police cells after failing to pay his cab fare. Police received a call around 2:30 am from a local cab company advising that a male individual ran off to avoid paying his fare. Police caught up with the individual, who was extremely intoxicated, walking down a street and was subsequently arrested. The individual was lodged in cells until sober at which time he was allowed to pay for the cab fare upon the company's request. There were no charges as a result of this incident.

### **November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

A staff member at the Morden Motor Inn called police for assistance regarding an incident with a guest staying at the hotel. Occupants staying in a room advised that a man just kicked their door in. Police spoke with the occupants of the room who advised that they had been at the bar earlier and returned to their room along with a co-worker. They had a few drinks and got into a disagreement at which time the co-worker was asked to leave. Upon leaving the room, the co-worker turned around and kicked the closed door, causing extensive damage to the frame. Police spoke with the suspect who admitted he was mad because he was punched in the face but should not have kicked the door. The suspect took responsibility and agreed to pay for the damages. There were no charges as a result of this incident.

### **December 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2015**

While serving a summons on an individual for breach of Probation, police learned that the 19 year old also had a Warrant for Arrest held by Carman RCMP. Police arrested the 19 year old male for the warrant and released him on a Promise to Appear in Morden Provincial Court in January.

A 30 year old Morden resident has been charged with breaching his undertaking when he was observed walking on North Railway Street in Morden. The accused was walking in close



proximity to a female and known to be on a no contact order with that female. The accused was charged in August 2015 for domestic assault against the victim and subsequently placed on the no contact order. The accused admitted to talking to the victim briefly and was released on a Promise to Appear in Morden Provincial Court in January.

#### **December 4<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police were called to assist a family with a child under the age of 12 who was being violent and throwing things around the home. The girl was upset that she was not allowed to leave the home for the evening and started throwing items at the mom. Police mediated the situation and departed the residence once the girl apologized for her actions.

#### **December 4<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a call from a witness who observed a vehicle lose control and hit a parked vehicle in the parking lot of Pembina Valley Dodge located on 5<sup>th</sup> Street in Morden. Police attended and located a truck running and parked facing north on 5<sup>th</sup> street next to the Pembina Valley Dodge parking lot with damage to the front end. Police observed a driver and passenger sitting in the vehicle. When the driver was asked what happened, he advised that he made a mistake and hit the truck. Police noted an odor of liquor on the accused's breath and red eyes. The witness observed the vehicle turn north onto 5<sup>th</sup> Street from North Railway Street at a fast rate of speed and swerve across the road, hitting another vehicle. The driver was then seen getting out of his vehicle to check on the damage. A demand was made for the driver to provide a sample of his breath on a roadside screening device which registered a fail. The driver was arrested for impaired driving and transported to the Morden Police Service for further testing. Two samples of the driver's breath were obtained and analyzed at 130 and 120mg%. The 61 year old driver is charged with impaired driving and driving over .08 and will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

#### **December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police arrested a 53 year old male under the Intoxicated Persons Detention Act after being called to a residence. Around 3:00 am, the occupant of the home called and advised that her husband was at the residence and intoxicated. The two were living apart and she wanted him removed. The accused was lodged in cells until sober and release without charges.

#### **December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police are investigating a theft from Stephen Street Wear in Morden. At Approximately 12:00 pm, police received a call from the store advising that two females just left with a jacket that was not paid for. One of the females was wearing a tweed jacket with white mukluks. The second female had dark hair, dark glasses and wearing a dark jacket. Both females were in their 30's, white with darker features. ## Phone Scams

The warning of various scams seems to be a repetitive message however, Morden Police Service is still receiving calls and complaints regarding these incidents. The most popular phone scam is the Canada Revenue Agency scam where the caller advises the person that they owe money and to send it immediately, otherwise there will be a warrant for their arrest. The caller then advises that they need to clear this matter up immediately by sending money either by MoneyGram or Western Union. Canada Revenue Agency does not make personal phone calls such as this if people owe money. Hundreds of these fraud attempts have been reported to police services in the region over the past year. The public is advised to hang up immediately when they receive such a call and never give out any personal information over the phone such as bank account or credit card numbers.

### **November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

A vehicle was observed travelling south on Route 100 in Morden with an obscured rear license plate. The vehicle turned west onto Wilcocks Road at which time police conducted a traffic stop. Police spoke with the driver and two passengers and instantly detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The driver was asked to exit the vehicle and was observed to have difficulty with his balance, using the vehicle to steady himself. While speaking with him, an odor of marijuana could be detected on his breath. The driver admitted to smoking marijuana 3 hours ago and had not consumed any alcohol. A Standardized Field Sobriety Test was conducted on the driver which resulted in a fail. A search of the vehicle revealed a small quantity of marijuana along with several items of drug paraphernalia. The 16 year old driver was issued a 24 hour suspension of his driver's license as well as a warning for possession of a controlled substance. He was transported home and turned over to a parent.

### **November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police conducted an MPI Roadwatch checkstop this date resulting in the following charges:

- 2 charges under the Highway Traffic Act (Drive Unregistered Vehicle, Drive Suspended)

### **November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2015**

Police stopped a vehicle around 1:13 am and while speaking with the driver, detected an odor of liquor on her breath. A demand was made for the driver to provide a sample of her breath on a roadside screening device which resulted in a fail. The driver was placed under arrest for impaired driving and while escorting her to the rear of the police vehicle, she began to resist and became aggressive by kicking and pulling her arms away. She was eventually restrained and transported back to the police station where she continued to resist and fight with police. A search of her pockets revealed a small plastic baggie with a white powdery substance believed to be cocaine. The driver eventually provided two samples of her breath resulting in readings of 100 and 90 mg%. The 20 year old Morden resident is charged with Drive Impaired, Drive over .08, Resist Arrest and Possession of a Controlled Substance - Cocaine. She will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

### **November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2015**

A 34 year old Morden man is facing several charges after police received a 911 call to a residence where an assault had taken place. Police received a call from a female who was crying and scared, indicating she was hiding in her bedroom after being punched in the face twice by her common law partner. Police attended the residence and confirmed with the victim that she had been assaulted. The victim had injuries to her mouth from being punched and police observed blood on the kitchen floor. The accused was standing in the living room and was visibly intoxicated, swaying on his feet and a strong odor of liquor. The accused had one hand in his pocket and was advised to remove it but refused. He was physically restrained and transported to the Morden Police Service. The accused continued to resist and was uncooperative with police. Due to an extensive criminal record which includes failing to attend court, failing to comply with undertakings, probation orders, and recognizance orders, utter threats and assaulting a police officer, the accused was remanded into custody and transported to the Winnipeg Remand Centre where he awaits his next court appearance on December 1<sup>st</sup>.

Police responded to an unrelated 911 call where a male was located in a residence with a strong odor of liquor on his breath. A check with police dispatch indicated the male was on an Undertaking with conditions to abstain from alcohol and not to consume or possess illegal substances. The 30 year old Morden resident is charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance and 2 counts of Breach of Undertaking. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

As a result, a 49 year old Morden resident has been charged with Impaired Driving and Driving over the legal limit of .08. The vehicle was seized



for a mandatory 30 day vehicle impoundment. The accused was released to appear in Morden Provincial Court in December.

### **November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

At around 1:50 am, police were on general patrol travelling westbound on Thornhill Street and observed a vehicle in a parking lot near a business. As police approached the vehicle, the driver turned off the headlights. Police attended to the vehicle and spoke with the driver and its occupants. Police observed an open bottle of Vodka on the floor board by the passenger's feet. The passenger admitted to police that he was drinking from the bottle and it belonged to him. As a result, a 19 year old Winkler resident was charged with Unlawful Transportation of Liquor in a Motor Vehicle.

### **November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a Mischief complaint from an individual who had parked their vehicle on Gilmour Street outside the Morden Collegiate. The owner had parked the vehicle between the hours of 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm and returned to find horizontal and vertical scratch marks in the paint. At around 2:10 am, police received a call from an off duty Morden police officer reporting a possible Impaired Driver. The off duty police officer reported that the vehicle was travelling west bound on Hwy #3 entering Morden and was grossly weaving in the lanes of traffic. As the suspect vehicle entered the City of Morden the vehicle continued to travel into the oncoming lanes of traffic. While uniform police officers were responding to the complaint, the suspect vehicle collided with the curb causing damage to one of its wheels. The off duty police officers continued to follow the suspect vehicle until on duty members conducted a traffic stop. Police spoke with the driver and requested his driver's license and registration. The driver showed numerous indicators of Impaired driving and had difficulty locating his license. Police could detect a strong odor of liquor on the driver's breath. Upon exiting the vehicle the driver leaned heavily on the door and staggered back and leaned up against the vehicle. The driver was arrested for impaired driving and transported to the Morden Police Service. The accused provided breath samples of 140 mg%. As a result, a 25 year old resident of Winkler has been charged with Impaired Driving and Driving over the legal limit of .08. The vehicle was seized for a mandatory 30 day vehicle impoundment. The accused has had a prior conviction for Impaired Driving and was released to appear in Morden Provincial Court in December.

### **November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

While conducting a MPI check stop program, at around 12:45 am police observed a vehicle to accelerate quickly and squeal the tires. Police followed the vehicle east bound on Thornhill Street and observed the vehicle weaving in the lane. Police conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and advised the driver of the reason for the stop. Upon speaking with the driver, police observed open alcohol containers in the cup holders. Police could detect an odor of liquor on the

driver's breath. The driver was subsequently placed on a road side screening device which resulted in a "fail". The driver was subsequently arrested for Driving over the legal limit of .08. A search of the vehicle was conducted and police located and seized numerous open alcohol containers throughout the vehicle. The accused was transported to the Morden Police Service and provided breath samples of 170mg%, over twice the legal limit to operate a Motor Vehicle. As a result, an 18 year old Schanzenfeld resident has been charged with Impaired Driving and Driving over the legal limit of .08. The vehicle was seized for a mandatory 60 day vehicle impoundment. The accused was released to appear in Morden Provincial Court in December.

He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in October. The 18 year old passenger was issued a Provincial Offence Notice for unlawful transportation of liquor in a motor vehicle.

## **September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

The Morden Police Service is once again joining up with Manitoba Public Insurance by participating in the School Safety Enforcement Program. The extra patrols began September 8<sup>th</sup> as well as September 10<sup>th</sup>. Some Patrols were stationary, monitoring traffic in various locations, as well as roving patrols around all the schools in Morden. The purpose of this program is to enhance the presence of officers already in and around the school zones to detect infractions – particularly infractions related to school buses and school zones (such as passing stopped school buses, failing to yield right of way to pedestrians at marked corridors, passing vehicles stopped for pedestrians, distracted driving offences, failure to wear a seatbelt and speeding). During this time, Morden Police Service issued a total of 11 offence notices and 8 warnings for infractions including speeding, drive unregistered vehicle, disobey traffic control device –red lights and use a cellular device. The hope is to be able to run these programs several times throughout the school year in conjunction with our regular patrols to help maintain a safe environment in and around the school zones.

## **September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a call for assistance at a residence in Morden regarding a domestic dispute. The caller indicated that her ex-boyfriend was currently at her residence and refused to leave. Police

attended and spoke with both individuals who indicated the dispute was over child custody. There was a disagreement between the couple as well as the children and words were exchanged. Police mediated the situation until it was determined to be under control. There were no reports of any threats or assault and therefore no further action was required.

### **September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Around 11:00 pm, police received a call of an intoxicated individual that was unlawfully inside their residence. Police attended and observed the female suspect wandering down a hallway showing signs of intoxication. The victim advised that the suspect knocked at his door and woke him up and when he opened the door, the suspect entered his apartment. The 47 year old female from Morden was arrested under the Intoxicated Persons Detention Act and lodged in cells overnight until sober. She was released in the morning without charges.

### **September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

A 23 year old male was transported to Boundary Trails Health Centre after being found acting in a peculiar manner. Police initially received a call around 10:15 am from the Morden Daycare on Rampton Street reporting a male individual on their lot who appeared to be intoxicated by alcohol or under the influence of some other substance. Police attended and eventually located the individual wandering in a field directly south of the Daycare Centre. The male appeared visibly impaired and under the influence of an unknown substance. He had difficulties speaking and did not make sense with his conversation. The individual was transported for medical assistance and police are continuing their investigation.

### **September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a call at 9:55 am from a resident in Morden advising there were 3 young people smoking marihuana in a backyard, right next to a home daycare. Police attended and located the three youth, ages 15 and 16. The group admitted to smoking marihuana and handed over a small homemade pipe, a grinder and a pill bottle with some residue. All items were seized and parents were contacted. The youth were issued warnings for possession of a controlled substance.

### **September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police have charged a 20 year old male with fail to appear for identification purposes. The accused failed to attend the Morden Police Service for the purpose of providing his fingerprints as part of his release on a Summons on July 31<sup>st</sup>. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in October.

The caller was watching the individual who then climbed the fence to gain access into the compound. Police attended the area and eventually found the individual walking east on North Railway Street near Nelson Street. The suspect advised police that he went into the compound to get some property out of his vehicle that was impounded. Police arrested the individual for trespassing and theft. Some loose coins, a roll of nickels, a small flashlight and some gum were found on the suspect who admitted he took them from another vehicle in the compound. A check with police dispatch revealed a Warrant for Arrest for failing to appear on charges of possessing property obtained by crime. The 20 year old Morden resident was release on a Promise to Appear in Morden Provincial Court in October to deal with his previous charges.

### **September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police were called to a housing complex at 5:10 am in Morden regarding an individual who was not to be on the property. Police attended and located several individuals in an apartment. All individuals had been drinking and were intoxicated. While dealing with the situation, a female in the group struck another individual in the face, knocking him off his chair. The female was arrested for breach of peace and being intoxicated. The 47 year old female was lodged in cells until sober and then released.

### **September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

A curfew check was conducted on a 17 year old male around 1:30 am. The young person was placed on an Undertaking by the Morden Police Service on June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015 with the following condition: observe a curfew of 10:00 pm to 7:00 am daily except for medical emergencies. The youth was found not to be home at the time and as a result, will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in September.

The 18 year old driver is charged with drive impaired and drive over .08 and will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in October.

### **July 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2015**

A wallet was stolen from a vehicle on July 11<sup>th</sup> sometime between 9:00 am and 2:00 pm. ## **July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

2. Call to set up pre-authorized payments (which would involve providing personal banking information)
3. Send a lump sum cheque to a certain address

As mentioned, these letters appear authentic but again, one should never give out any personal information and ensure you are familiar with the situation or request.

### **July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a call of a 45 year old female who was causing a disturbance at a residence. Police attended the residence and found the female sitting on the couch with a male and appeared to be intoxicated. The woman was slurring her words and not making much sense. Police attempted to escort the woman from the premises as she had difficulty standing and walking on her own. It was learned that she was also on some medication and mixing it with alcohol, resulting in mood swings and drifting in and out of consciousness. Paramedics were called to assess the individual at which time she was transported to Boundary Trails Health Centre for further observation. Police were called back to the hospital due to her combative state. She was lodged in cells overnight and later released when sober. There were no charges as a result of this incident.

### **July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

The 37-year-old driver from Portage La Prairie is charged with driving impaired, driving over .08, drive an unregistered vehicle as well as driver – carry liquor in a vehicle contrary to the Liquor and Gaming Control Act. She will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in June.

## May 29<sup>th</sup>, 2015

Police received a complaint of a vehicle running through a red light at the corner of 11<sup>th</sup> Street and Thornhill Street in Morden. Around 12:40pm this day, a parent was watching his child cross the intersection with the crossing mechanism activated. Police received another complaint of "The Mystery Shopper" scam. A resident received a cheque in the mail. She was to do some monetary transactions in exchange for a portion of the money. She took the cheque to her local bank and it was identified as fraudulent. A reminder to residents that you can check on phonebusters.com website to search for similar scams and checking with police prior to getting involved in these incidents is a very good idea.

Morden Police conducted another MPI sponsored Distracted Driving Checkstop. On this date 8 people were charged for using a Cellular phone or other electronic hand held device while driving. Of note one person was charged for the second time in as many weeks and stated to the officer they will not stop. The fine for an offence like this is \$203.80 plus demerit points on the offender's license. The purchase of a blue tooth device or pulling over to stop at a safe location to conduct your phone call or text message is a much cheaper or safer alternative.

Police received a call of some teenagers entering the Fire training house located near the Compost site. Police attended and located two youth inside the house. The house was locked but the youth forced their way inside the building. They were taken home to their parents and given a police caution.

Police remind people attending to Lake Minnewasta that the cabins are privately owned and unauthorized entry onto the properties may result in charges.

Police attempted to wake the individual who was extremely intoxicated and asleep. The suspect was eventually removed from the hot tub and claimed that he thought he was at his mother's residence. Upon further investigation, it was

learned that the caller actually held a party at the residence the night before and this individual who was asleep in his hot tub was part of that gathering. Police arrested the 21 year old male under the Intoxicated Persons Detention Act. He was lodged in cells until sober and released. Police are continuing their investigation with possible charges of mischief as a result of damage to part of the hot tub.

## **April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

The Morden Police Service would like to remind the public of an important intersection in the City of Morden. Over the past week, police have received several complaints regarding the traffic lights on Thornhill Street and the intersection of 11<sup>th</sup> Street. These traffic lights are primarily used to assist pedestrians/students to cross the highway. When activated by the pedestrian, the traffic light will turn amber and then red alerting traffic to stop. Once the pedestrians have crossed the street, traffic must remain stopped while the red light is active and until it changes to green. This light is like any other traffic light and the same rules apply.

## **April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police have a Warrant for Arrest for 24 year old Eugene Franklin MCKAY of Winkler. McKay faces two charges of failing to comply with his probation order. He was placed on a two year probation following charges of theft of motor vehicle, break and enter, obstruct/resist a peace officer as well as failing to comply with a probation order. Some of the conditions of his order were to report to a Probation Officer within 2 days of release from custody and to notify his Probation Officer of any change of address. The accused failed to comply with these conditions and as a result, a warrant for his arrest was issued. ## **April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police received a complaint around 2:45pm of two youth, ages 16 and 17, consuming liquor. Police later had opportunity to come across one of the youth walking on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street in Morden. An odor of liquor was detected on his breath and he was subsequently issued a Provincial Offence Notice for possession or consumption of liquor as a minor. He was transported to his residence and turned over to a parent.

## **April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

For the second week in a row, police were notified of another semi truck striking the north-east traffic light standard at Thornhill Street and 1<sup>st</sup> Street in Morden. This time, the driver contacted police and remained at the scene. The light standard was knocked onto a parking lot and was not obstructing traffic. All other lights at the intersection were currently working. Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation were contacted to repair the light.

## **April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Police were alerted to a Mystery Shopper scam that a resident had received information on. The victim received a text message from Group Survey stating they are recruiting mystery shoppers. As this was something the victim was interested in doing before he received the message, he accepted the offer. He then received an email explaining the process and soon after, received a cheque in the mail. The victim was to deposit, then withdraw \$2500.00 and go to a Royal Bank

to deposit it to a certain transit and account number. His second assignment was to go to a Shoppers Drug Mart Post Office and send a money gram to a certain person in Belgium. The cheque of course came back counterfeit. A second cheque was sent a week later but the victim did not cash it. Police would like to once again remind the public to be cautious of these types of scams and to never give out any personal information over the phone or through by email.

### **April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

The Morden Police Service is once again participating in the Distracted Driver Enforcement Program. The program is funded by Manitoba Public Insurance and works in conjunction with Police Services, enhancing enforcement through organized enforcement activity to detect infractions – particularly related to distracted driving offences. The first checkstop was held April 30<sup>th</sup> which resulted in 15 offence notices being issued for drivers using a cellular telephone or other hand-operated electronic device. The fine for using a cellular telephone or other hand-operated electronic device while driving is \$203.80 and demerit points. Police will be continuing this program into the month of May.

### **April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

Around 7:30pm this date, police received a call from Morden RCMP requesting officers attend the RCMP station to speak with a possible victim of domestic assault. Officers attended to the Morden RCMP station and spoke with the victim who had visible injuries to his face and neck. The victim related that he had been assaulted by his common law partner at Rock's Bar & Grill and again at their home. The accused was later arrested and brought to the Morden Police Service. Both the victim and the accused had consumed alcohol throughout the day. The accused was lodged in police cells to sober up and pending release. At one point in the evening, the accused became upset and began acting out in the cells; yelling, screaming and banging on the cell door. She then attempted to flood the cell floor, scratched the inside of the cell door and inflicted numerous superficial scratches to her arm with an unknown object. Police attempted to restrain the accused after continuing to cause more injuries to herself, inflicting superficial scratches on her arms and rubbing the blood on her arms onto police. Paramedics were called to assess her injuries. The accused was transported to Boundary Trails Health Centre for medical attention and then returned to police cells. The 33 year old female from Morden is charged with 2 counts of assault, 1 count of breach of probation, 1 count of mischief under \$5000.00 and 2 counts of assault police officer. She was remanded into custody and transported to the Women's Correctional Centre in Headingley where she awaits her next court appearance.

### **May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015**

Police are investigating a firearms complaint which occurred in Morden. A witness observed an individual placing a firearm in the back of a truck on Gilmour Street. Police attended the area and found 3 individuals standing around a truck. Upon speaking with the individuals, one of them admitted to putting a shotgun behind the seat which belonged to his grandfather.

None of the three adult males had a license to possess firearms. The shotgun was seized and police continue their investigation.

## **May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015**

Around 3:55am, police received a call from a resident stating there was a fight in progress at the Ecole Morden Middle School parking lot. Police attended and located an individual lying on the boulevard crying and yelling along two friends standing by. The two friends advised that the individual, who was 17 years old, had been drinking and was emotional. Police spoke with the individual who had a strong odor of liquor on his breath, slurred speech and poor balance. He was served a Provincial Offence Notice for consuming liquor as a minor and turned over to a parent.

## **April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

At approximately 10:30am this date, police learned of an accident in front of the Morden Police Service on Stephen Street where both vehicles involved were blocking eastbound traffic. The driver of the first vehicle advised she was driving eastbound on Stephen Street at approximately 30-35km/hr. when she was rear ended by another vehicle. At this point, police formed the opinion the accused was impaired by alcohol and was advised of her arrest for impaired driving. An empty bottle of liquor was found in the accused's purse. While dealing with this incident, a separate witness attended the Morden Police Service to report an incident involving the accused. The witness was

travelling on North Railway Street in Morden with her 5 year old child in the vehicle just minutes before, when the suspect vehicle was travelling towards her and began to drift into her lane, coming inches from hitting her vehicle. Two breath samples were obtained from the accused which registered 310 and 300mg%, over three times the legal limit. The 28 year old female from Winkler is charged with drive over .08 and drive impaired. She will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in May.

### **April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2015**

Police were on general patrol following a vehicle on 6<sup>th</sup> Street in Morden. A license plate query was conducted through police dispatch on the vehicle which indicated it was unregistered. The vehicle was stopped and upon speaking with the driver, an odor of liquor was detected on their breath. The driver was requested to provide a sample of their breath on a roadside screening device which registered a warning. The driver was issued a Provincial Offence Notice for drive an unregistered vehicle as well as a 24 hour suspension of their driver's license.

### **April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2015**

In March, Morden Police Service reported having a Warrant for Arrest for 33 year old Jeremiah James Alguire of no fixed address for breach of his recognizance. On this date at approximately 10:20am, police were on patrol in the parking lot of the Minnewasta Estates apartments. Police observed a car parked with a person reclined in the front seat pretending to be sleeping. Police approached the person and recognized him to be the accused, Jeremiah Alguire. The truck was stopped and the driver advised of the incident. The driver advised that he was aware he hit the traffic light standard but was going to call when he arrived at his destination. It was explained that the law required him to stop and remain at the scene of an accident. The driver will be charged with failing to remain at the scene of an accident under the Highway Traffic Act.

### **April 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2015**

Police received a call from Pembina Valley Containers in Morden reporting an incident which occurred at their business. This past Monday, a group of workers left work around 9:30pm and noticed the four way flashers on in one of the work vehicles. The lights were turned off but the next morning around 6:00am, they were back on again. They also noticed that several items were tampered with on the yard and some aluminum cans were taken. It was determined that an employee was responsible for these incidents which were occurring after hours and the situation was dealt with by the employer.
