December 19th, 2016

Police received a report from the victim, that on the previous day, his vehicle was damaged by an individual that was known to him. The victim explained that he was travelling in his vehicle and observed the suspect to be upset and yelling at him over a past incident. The victim continued to drive away but was followed by the suspect, who continued to yell and swear at him, and he began punching the driver side of his vehicle. The victim again drove away but was followed to the next intersection, where the suspect continued to yell and swear at him, and began punching the passenger side of his vehicle. Police observed numerous dents on both sides of the victim's vehicle. Police obtained a formal statement from the victim and charges are pending against the suspect.

December 21st , 2016

On December 8th, 2016 police received a report of a Hit and Run accident that occurred outside a local Morden business. The victim completed a Traffic Accident Report with police but no suspect was identified as no information had been left with the victim. On this date the suspect attended to the Morden Police Service, as a result of reading a prior Police Media Release, and believed they were responsible for the damage to the victims vehicle. Police were able to determine that the suspect vehicle had caused the damage and as a result a 76

year old resident of Morden was charged under the Highway Traffic Act for failing to exchange particulars at the scene of an accident.

December 23rd, 2016

Police received a report of a hit and run accident that occurred on this date between 7:00 and 8:30 am in the parking lot by Shifters in Morden. The driver of a 2015 grey Chrysler 200 returned to their vehicle and noticed the driver side of the vehicle to be dented and scraped. December 26th, 2016

Police received a call from a resident reporting that he believed an assault had occurred inside his residence. Police attended to the residence and spoke with two parties that had been involved in a dispute. The two suspects were known to each other and confirmed that an argument escalated to the point of pushing and shoving, with one of the parties being struck. Both parties were cooperative with police and did not want charges laid in this incident.

December 29th, 2016

Police received a call from the victim reporting that she had received a phone call from an individual from whom she had a Protection Order. The accused had told the victim that he would be at her residence shortly, contrary to his conditions not to attend the City of Morden and Not to Contact the Victim. Police attended to the area but were unable to locate the accused. While police were speaking with the victim, the accused contacted her again and police took the phone and were able to recognize the accused voice. At the time of the call, police believed the accused to be residing in another jurisdiction away from Morden. The next day the accused was located by police, on the same street as the victim, and he was arrested. The 53 year old male was charged with Breaching a Protection Order and 2 counts of Breaching his Probation Order. The accused was remanded into custody and transported to the Winnipeg Remand Centre to await his next court appearance.

December 30th, 2016

Police received a report of a Theft that occurred sometime between 12 noon and 12:30 pm from their business located in the 300 block of Stephen Street. The victim advised police that they had heard someone enter the business, between those times, but did not notice anything missing until a short time later. The victim is now missing a brown brief case described as having a top flap with a shoulder strap, and a black Ipad mini. Police received a description of a person

of interest who was in the area at the time. Police are wishing to speak with this person described as a short female, approximately 40 years of age and who was wearing a white jacket. Police continue to investigate this matter.

December 31st, 2016

Police received a call from a female victim reporting that she been assaulted by a male suspect. The victim reported that she had gone to sleep with her boyfriend and awoke to male acquaintance who was touching her in a sexual manner. The suspect was confronted by the boyfriend and fled the residence upon police arrival. Police continued to investigate the matter and the suspect was located later in the day and arrested. A 49 year old resident of Winkler has been charged with Sexual Assault and breaching the conditions of his Undertaking. The accused was released on more conditions and will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in February.

Police received a report of an attempted Break and Enter to a residence in the 100 block of 9th Street. Police attended to the victims' residence and located extensive damage to a rear door that opens into the attached garage portion of the residence. The suspect(s) are believed to have pryed at this door but were unable to gain entry into the residence. The homeowners had left their house the evening prior and returned on this date to see the damage. December 12th, 2016

Police received a call around 9:45 pm regarding a female screaming and a disturbance at a residence. Police attended to find a male and female at the residence but they denied anything was wrong. There were no signs of any assault or reports of a threat. Police departed the residence and ran a check on the couple that indicated the male individual was on an undertaking with conditions not to communicate with the female due to previous charges of uttering threats to kill just three days previous. Police returned to the residence and arrested the 31-year-old Morden man for breach of undertaking. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial court in January.

December 13th, 2016

There were no injuries as a result of a motor vehicle accident at the intersection of Thornhill Street and Nelson Street around 9:00 am this date. A vehicle was travelling west bound on Thornhill Street with a second vehicle east bound. The eastbound vehicle attempted to turn north onto Nelson Street and was struck by the westbound vehicle. Both vehicles required towing from the scene.

December 13th, 2016

Police received a report of a hit and run accident that occurred on December 8th between 5:20 and 5:30 pm in the parking lot by Little Caesars in Morden. The driver of a 2012 grey Toyota Camry was travelling through the parking lot when a vehicle backed out of a parking spot and contacted their vehicle, causing damage to the passenger's front door. The driver of the suspect vehicle continued to back out and left the parking lot. A description of the suspect vehicle was not obtained. December 14th, 2016

There were no serious injuries as a result of a pedestrian motor vehicle accident at the intersection of Thornhill Street and 5th Street in Morden. Around 12:05 pm, a 12-year-old male activated the crosswalk lights and was half way through the first lane when a vehicle coming off of 5th Street turned onto Thornhill Street and contacted the pedestrian's right leg. The driver of the vehicle stopped to check on the pedestrian to ensure he was not injured. Police are continuing their investigation.

December 14th, 2016

Police have a Warrant for Arrest for 29-year-old Joseph Russell Mitchell of Roseau River, Manitoba for failing to attend court. Mitchell was before the courts on charges of mischief, theft, possession of break in instruments and two counts of failing to attend court. On November 10th, Mitchell was released on a Recognizance to attend Morden Provincial Court on November 24th and then remanded to December 13th, but failed to show up. December 15th, 2016

A snowboard stolen 8 years ago has been returned to its rightful owner. The victim called police to advise she reported her snowboard stolen 8 years ago and just noticed one on Varage Sale identical to hers. Police followed up and spoke with the seller who at first denied still having the snowboard and then changed his story several times as to where he got it from. Eventually, the snowboard was turned over to police and returned to the owner. There were no charges as a result of this incident.

December 15th, 2016

Police received a call from an individual who just witnessed a hit and run accident that occurred on the Esso gas bar parking lot in Morden. A vehicle was observed backing out of its parking spot and scraping the passenger's side rear portion of another vehicle. The suspect vehicle then drove off without stopping to check on damages or to leave their information. Police followed up with the owner of the suspect vehicle from the license plate number provided by the witness. The driver of the vehicle at the time of the accident was a 16-year-old female who admitted to hitting the vehicle, but was scared and drove off. The

driver was charged with leaving the scene of an accident without exchanging information.

December 15th, 2016

Police received a 911 call of a motor vehicle accident at 9th Street and Wardrop Street in Morden. A vehicle was stopped on 9th Street facing northbound at Wardrop Street. The driver was waiting for a pedestrian to cross, but eventually proceeded into the intersection and did not see a vehicle travelling eastbound on Wardrop Street. Two passengers were examined at the scene by paramedics and released without any serious injuries. Both vehicles required towing from the scene.

December 16th, 2016

Police are seeking information from a driver involved in an accident that occurred on December 12th around 2:00 pm. The victim was parked on Stephen Street facing west across from the Agassiz Medical Centre. A red truck drove past, coming in contact with the victim's mirror. The suspect driver pulled over and spoke with the victim about the accident, but forgot to exchange particulars. Both vehicles have damage to their side mirrors. The driver is asked to contact the Morden Police Service at 822-4900 to provide their information regarding this accident.

December 14th, 2016

A 52-year-old Morden man who was charged back in August for reporting there would be a terrorist attack during the 2016 Corn & Apple Festival has pled guilty to Public Mischief. The week leading up to the festival, Morden Police received information from the accused with specific details about a terrorist attack during the Corn & Apple Festival. The report was confirmed several times with the accused to ensure that his information was accurate, which he assured police it was. As a result of this information, police contacted the National Security Enforcement Section to assist with the investigation. After several interviews and many hours involving resources from several agencies, the accused admitted that the information was not factual. The accused appeared in Morden Provincial Court November 24th and received a fine of \$1300.00, a period of Probation as well as required to reimburse all police agencies for costs totaling \$4,551.00 in the many hours that were spent as a result of this investigation.

December 5th, 2016

Police have charged a 26-year-old female from Morden with three counts of Obtaining Credit by Fraud or False Pretence. The female attended the Giant Tiger store Morden, stocked her shopping cart and then proceeded to the checkout. When at the checkout, she asked to return some items in order to get credit because the store has a no receipt return policy. The female signed a receipt and received credit for the items she never did initially pay for. The accused was arrested and admitted to purchasing some items from the store that day with the credit and then returned the next day to purchase more items with the remaining credit. The total amount of credit obtained was approximately \$111.00. The accused was released on a Promise to Appear in Morden Provincial Court in January.

December 5th, 2016

Police are investigating the fraudulent use of a debit card after the owner forgot to remove their card from the automated teller machine. The owner used the bank card at the ATM around 2:00 pm on the 2nd of December and then realized she either forgot her card or lost it. She checked her account later and noticed several transactions using her debit card at locations in Morden and some in Winkler. Police are continuing their investigation.

December 5th, 2016

Police received a report of a hit and run accident that occurred on November 25^h around noon in the parking lot of Décor Cabinets in Morden. The owner returned to his vehicle to find damage to the right front fender and signal light of his 2006 black Honda Civic. December 9th, 2016

A 911 call was received of a four-vehicle accident at the corner of 2nd Street and Thornhill Street in Morden. Fire Rescue and ambulance were also dispatched. Police attended to find that a vehicle was travelling east on Thornhill Street in the median lane. A second vehicle was travelling west bound on Thornhill Street in the curb lane. The first vehicle made a left turn north onto 2nd Street and was struck on the passenger’s side by the westbound vehicle. As a result, the first vehicle was pushed into a third vehicle that was stopped facing southbound on 2nd Street at the stop sign and then pushed back into a fourth vehicle behind. Two occupants of the first vehicle received minor injuries and one was transported by ambulance to Boundary Trails Health Centre for further observation. Two of the vehicles required towing from the scene.

December 9th, 2016

Police have charged a 31-year-old Morden man with two counts of uttering threats as well as one count of possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose. Police were called around 9:00 pm regarding two people who attended a residence to pick up some personal items. As they drove past the house, the accused exited the home holding a knife in his hand. The people remained in their vehicle and began to drive away as the accused ran down the driveway swinging the knife. After driving away, one of the individuals received a phone call from the accused and stated he was going to kill her and the passenger in her car. The accused was arrested and released on a Promise to Appear and Undertaking with conditions to have no contact or communication with the two victims. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

December 11th, 2016

Police received a call around 4:55 am from a female requesting her intoxicated boyfriend be removed from the home, as he was upset and throwing things around. Police could hear yelling in the background and immediately attended. The caller let police into the home and directed police to the bedroom where the suspect was. The suspect, who showed signs of intoxication, immediately got upset and began swearing at police. He was placed under arrest for breach of peace and escorted out of the home. The suspect continued to be difficult, challenging police to remove his handcuffs to see what would happen. The accused was lodged in cells and released later in the day when sober without charges. Minutes later, police were called to the same residence advising the male was again out of control. Police attended but found that the caller was in fact the one that appeared to be upset and causing the issues this time. Neither reported any assault or threats and police remained on scene until one of the occupants left the residence to stay at another location. No further action was required at this time.

December 11th, 2016

Multiple 911 calls were received around 10:15 pm of a male walking into traffic on highway #3 between the John Deere dealership and Morden. Police attended and found the male in the west bound lanes attempting to get into a vehicle. Police approached the male who had a strong odor of liquor on his breath. The accused was belligerent with police and tried to walk away. He was arrested under the Intoxicated Persons Detention Act and lodged in cells overnight until sober. He was released in the morning without charges.

November 28th, 2016

Police received a call around 8:15 pm from a woman to report there was a man at her door who she had a Protection Order against with conditions not to have any contact or communication with her or to attend within 200 meters of her residence.

Police attended but the suspect was gone. The victim advised that she did not see the suspect but recognized his voice when he asked to be let in to the house. At approximately 8:40 pm, the victim called police again to report the suspect was banging on her door. Police immediately attended but again, the suspect was gone. Police parked a distance from the residence and watched to find a male in a dark jacket and hoodie approach the victim's door. The male knocked at the door at which time officers approached and arrested the man. The suspect is also on a Probation Order with the same conditions not to have any contact or communication with the victim or to attend within 200 meters of her residence. He is also on charge for breaching the exact same order previously. The 53 year old male, of no fixed address, is charged with 2 counts of disobey court order as well as 4 counts of breach of probation order. Due to his previous charges, he was remanded into custody and transported to the Winnipeg Remand Centre where he remains pending his next court appearance.

December 1st, 2016

A 16 year old youth is facing several charges including 2 counts of break & enter to a residence, 3 counts of trespass at night as well as breach of probation.

Around 12:30 am, police received a call from a resident in Morden advising that a male just walked into his home and was high or intoxicated. The homeowner kicked the male out and called police. Police searched the area but were unable to find the suspect. Then around 2:24 am, police received a second call from a resident advising that someone had just run through his back yard and now, observed this individual at his neighbors pulling on their door. A description was provided of the male suspect who was now running through back yards on 1st Street in Morden. Police attended and observed a male standing in a car port in the location of the incidents. Police approached and the suspect ran into the back yard. Police gave chase on foot and the suspect scaled several fences in back yards in an attempt to evade police. While searching for the suspect, another resident advised that a male just dropped a phone on the ground outside her door and had entered the porch area of their home. The suspect also dropped an article related to drug use inside the porch. At 3:00 am, police received a third call of an individual banging on a door to a residence. Police attended the area and observed a suspect running through yards. Police again pursued the individual on foot but the suspect continued to try and get away. Police were able to catch up to the suspect and tackled him to the ground. The suspect continued to fight and struggle with police, but was eventually handcuffed. Police later received more calls of this individual in back yards as well as going through vehicles and entering homes. The youth will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

December 3rd, 2016

Police were on patrol around 2:20 am when they observed a vehicle turn northbound onto Mountain Street from Stephen Street, crossing over the centre line and then swerve back into its lane. The vehicle turned into Rock's Bar & Grill parking lot and police followed. The male driver exited his vehicle and walked up to the vendor doors. Police activated emergency lights and approached the driver. Police observed the individual had been drinking and requested a sample of his breath on a roadside screening device. The driver registered a fail and was subsequently arrested for impaired driving and transported for further testing. While searching the individual, some drug paraphernalia was found on his person as well. An open bottle of liquor was also found inside the vehicle behind the driver's seat. Further testing resulted in blood alcohol readings of 200 and 220 mg%. The 31-year-old driver from Morden is charged with Impaired Driving, Driving over .08 and As a Driver, carry Liquor in a vehicle contrary to the Liquor & Gaming Control Act. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

November 21st, 2016

In 2014, a joint forces operation between Morden Police Service, Winkler Police Service and the RCMP called **Project DENVER**, targeted drug trafficking and criminal activity in the Pembina Valley area. As a result, several individuals were charged with various offences. One of these individuals recently appeared in Portage La Prairie Queen's Bench Court and was found guilty of Trafficking in a Controlled Substance; namely cocaine. The accused was found to be in possession of half a pound of cocaine. Brett Ashton Krashel will appear back in court March 3rd, 2017 for sentencing. Krashel was also charged in relation to this project and found guilty of 2 counts of Breach of Recognizance and received a fine.

November 22nd, 2016

Police received a report of damage to a window in a home on Wardrop Street, believed to have been caused by a BB or pellet gun. Last week, the owners of the home heard a noise but did not think anything of it until noticing today that one of their windows had a hole in it. The youth is also on probation for a previous charge and will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

Police received a call around 8:20 pm of a male and female arguing at the apartment on Stephen Street in Morden. The caller advised that a female voice was heard screaming to call the police. Police attended the apartment and spoke to a male who advised that the couple was arguing over some medication that had gone missing. The female indicated that the male slapped her across the face at which time she began yelling for someone to call police. Also in the home was a child who confirmed having seen his dad slap his mom. The male suspect was arrested for assault and removed from the home. He was released on a Promise to Appear with an undertaking and conditions. He is charged with one count of assault as well as one count of breach of probation. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in January.

November 26th, 2016

Police received a report of mischief to a vehicle, which may have happened while parked at Tim Horton's in Morden. The owner parked his 2014 red Dodge Dart in the south parking lot around 10:30 pm and returned at 12:30 am to find scratches along the trunk and rear driver's side panel of his vehicle. August 9th, 2016

Members of the Morden Police Service were on patrol and conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a violation. Police spoke with the youth driver of the vehicle and had reason to believe there may be illegal substances inside the vehicle. The youth appeared very nervous and was shaking while speaking with police. The driver of the vehicle denied having anything illegal inside his vehicle and gave police consent to search. Officers located a small amount of marihuana inside the vehicle and he was arrested for Possession of Marihuana. The female also indicated that she was drinking with her boyfriend and awoke to him hitting her. She complained of sore ribs and had some dry blood around her mouth and a bump on her head. The victim was reluctant to provide any details to police and was transported to Boundary Trails Health Centre for observation. Police attended to assist hospital staff, as the victim was trying to leave because she was scared her boyfriend would find out. The victim eventually disclosed to police that her boyfriend was twisting her neck and hit her several times in the head and ribs, as he wanted her to go buy some beer. The accused was arrested and transported to Morden Police Service. The accused was previously charged for domestic assault against the same victim on February 19th, 2016. The accused was remanded into custody and transported to the Winnipeg Remand Centre where he was held until his next court appearance August 8th in Portage Provincial Court.

August 4th, 2016

Police received a call regarding an accident on Victoria Street just east of Route 100 in Morden. Two vehicles were travelling east bound on Victoria Street in the same lane. A vehicle in front stopped to make a turn and the two vehicles behind stopped as well. Another vehicle following failed to see the vehicles stopped and rear-ended the first vehicle, which in turn rear-ended the other vehicle in front of it. There were no injuries as a result of the accident but one vehicle received extensive damage and required towing from the scene.

July 25, 2016

At approximately 1025 am this date a person was pulling a 104 foot grain auger north on Mountain Street. They also received a cheque in mail to fly to Winnipeg for job training. A number of individuals were found to have been a victim of this fraud. This company does not fly people to Winnipeg for job training. People are reminded to verify a job offer over the phone to the actual company prior to supplying any personal information over the internet. It is unknown how many people fell victim to this scam.

A child bicycle trailer was reported stolen from the Meadowbrook area. The trailer is described as blue with yellow markings. Small tear in the top sunshade. This is the type that can also be pushed like a stroller or attached to a bicycle. He failed to upload the portion of the other individual apologizing to police for his reaction. This is a good example of people trying to post discrediting police conduct on social media and not showing all of the circumstances of what occurred.

July 29, 2016

Police received a complaint of littering. An individual was observed on more than one occasion attending his street mailbox and discarding his unwanted junk mail and flyers on the ground. The individual was spoken to and warned about littering.

At 3:45pm police received a complaint from a pedestrian that was crossing Thornhill at Mountain Street. As they were crossing the intersection using the activated crossing lights a vehicle came from behind and scraped her as she walked. She did not receive any injuries requiring medical treatment. The car did not stop and the pedestrian obtained a plate number. Other cars were honking at this driver. Police continue to investigate this complaint.

July 31, 2016

Police received a call at 0430 am about a vehicle that was parked in a driveway of the 300 block of 9th Street. The homeowner noticed the interior light on. They went to the vehicle and found the ignition had been tampered with and two portable DVD players were now missing. The vehicle was not locked.

July 13th, 2016

The homeowner advised that his sister and her boyfriend were yelling and screaming in the residence and his children were trying to sleep. Police are investigating a complaint of a laser being pointed at an aircraft while flying over Morden. The pilot and his passenger were flying over Lake Minnewasta just after 10:00 pm to observe the fireworks when they noticed a laser being pointed at them. The pilot advised that the laser was pointed at them for approximately 10 to 15 seconds causing him to be disoriented and temporarily blinded, losing his night vision and unable to see his instrument panel or outside. Police were able to locate the individual at a residence from the description of the area and approximate location given by the pilot. The one driver had his 4 year old daughter in the back seat at the time of this incident. Both drivers, ages 34 and 23, were charged with Racing with another Vehicle under the Highway Traffic Act. were impounded for 7 days and both drivers suspended from driving for 7 days for racing, under the authority of the Highway Traffic Act.

An 18-year-old male from Morden is facing several charges for failing to comply with various court orders. The accused was placed on a Recognizance on June 3rd, 2016 with conditions to abstain from the consumption of alcohol and to observe a curfew of 11:00 pm to 6:00 am. On February 4th, 2016 the accused was also placed on a Youth Probation Order to keep the peace, abstain from the consumption of alcohol, and to comply with a curfew ordered by his youth worker. Police were advised this date that the accused was picked up by his foster parents in Winkler past his curfew and had been consuming liquor. Police attended the residence and spoke with the accused that had an odor of liquor on his breath, was unsteady on his feet and had slurred speech. He was charged with one count of assault with a weapon, mischief over \$5000.00 as well as consumption of liquor by a minor. Later this same day around 5:15 pm, a witness statement was being taken from the mother regarding the incident. During the statement, the mother received a text from her husband indicating that their son was inside the house.

The mother called the son and asked him not to hurt his father. Police attended to the residence immediately and found the youth inside the home where he was placed under arrest for breaching his undertaking. The youth indicated that he just returned to the home for his cigarettes and cell phone. It was learned after that the youth entered the home unannounced; holding a knife in his hand at which time the youth's mother was contacted. The youth is now facing additional charges including 2 counts of failing to comply with conditions of an undertaking and possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose. He was remanded into custody and transported to the Manitoba Youth Centre and will be appearing in Portage Provincial Court June 20th.

The couple advised that they were separated and got back together for a few weeks, but it is not working out. Both individuals were intoxicated but advised that no assaults or threats took place, just arguing. A family member was present and confirmed no assaults or threats took place. Both agreed to discuss things in the morning when sober. There were no charges as a result of this incident.

A vehicle parked in the 700 block of Wardrop Street in Morden was vandalized sometime over the past several days. The owner noticed circular scratches on the driver's door. A vehicle was travelling westbound on Thornhill Street when a cyclist operating a 3-wheel bicycle attempted to cross the highway. speaking with the driver, police noticed an odor of liquor on his breath and observed him to have glossy eyes. A roadside test was administered for alcohol which registered a fail. The driver was arrested for impaired driving and transported for further testing. Two tests were obtained of the driver's breath which resulted in readings of 100 and 80 mg%. As a result of the readings, the 24 year old male driver from Morden was issued a 90 day administrative driver's license suspension as well as a 30 day impoundment of his motor vehicle. The victim had swelling to his face and blood in his mouth. As a result, a 36 year old male resident of Morden has been charged with Assault and will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in April.

March 22nd, 2016

Police received a call of a vehicle driving erratically and were provided with a description of the vehicle. Members of the Morden Police Service located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. While police were speaking with the driver, a heavy odor of marihuana was noted inside the vehicle. The driver was subsequently arrested for Possession of a Controlled Substance and taken into custody. A subsequent search of the vehicle located a quantity of fresh marihuana and some paraphernalia. A 21 year old resident of rural Morden has been charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance and will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in May.

March 22nd, 2016

Police received a 911 call from residents of Morden requesting police assistance with their foster son who was out of control. The caller informed police that there were some injuries and some damage to the residence. Police responded to the residence and took the accused into custody. Through a subsequent investigation, police discovered that the accused had become aggressive when confronted with turning down his music. The accused threw an item at the homeowners causing damage to a wall and striking both in the head. The accused then punched a door several times causing damage to it. Police learned that the accused had consumed a house hold product. The accused was taken to Boundary Trails Health Centre and was treated and released. The accused is charged with Assault with a weapon x 2, Mischief under \$5000, Breach of

Recognizance, and Breach of Probation. The accused was remanded into custody and transported to the Provincial Remand Center.

March 25th, 2016

While conducting a follow up investigation, members of the Morden Police Service attended to a residence in Morden. Police spoke with the homeowner and related that police were looking for a firearm. Police subsequently located and seized a Smith and Wesson 9mm handgun from the residence. The investigation is ongoing at this time.

March 26th, 2016

Police received a report from a motorist advising that they had been travelling on Hwy #3 near Buhler Drive, the previous evening, when their vehicle was hit with eggs. The driver believed that the eggs had been thrown from another vehicle and noticed a crack in the windshield as a result of the incident.

A 39 year old male from Morden has been remanded into custody following a curfew check. The accused was placed on a Recognizance by a Judge on August 13th, 2015 in Kenora, Ontario with conditions to abide by a curfew of 10:00 pm to 6:00 am and not to possess or consume any unlawful drugs unless with a valid prescription. A curfew check at the accused's residence around 10:06 pm this date found no one to be home. Police attended the Traveller's Inn and observed the accused sitting inside drinking a beer. The accused noticed police and attempted to leave but was arrested for breaching his curfew. Subsequent to his arrest, a search revealed a small plastic bag of white substance, believed to be cocaine, in the accused's wallet inside his back pocket. The accused was remanded into custody and transported to the Winnipeg Remand Centre where he will be appearing in Winnipeg court February 1st.

January 31st, 2016

While on patrol, police observed a vehicle around 1:30 am travelling east bound on Thornhill Street that appeared to be weaving in its lane. A traffic stop was conducted and while speaking with the driver, an odor of liquor could be detected in the vehicle. The driver produced a valid license which indicated him to be on a zero blood alcohol concentration restriction. A check with police dispatch also revealed the driver to be on an undertaking with a curfew and a condition to abstain from the consumption of alcohol. A demand was made for a roadside screening test which resulted in a fail. The driver was arrested for impaired driving as well as breaching his undertaking. Further breath tests were conducted and analyzed at 120 and 100 mg%. As a result, the 18 year old Darlingford resident is charged with impaired driving, driving over .08 and two counts of breaching his undertaking by not abiding by a curfew and consuming alcohol. He will be appearing in Morden Provincial Court in March.

February 1st, 2016

Last week, police reported a 22 year old male from Winkler facing charges of Assault Causing Bodily Harm after several people were assaulted outside of Tim Hortons in Morden. Due to the serious nature of this incident and the extent of injuries, these charges have been upgraded to Aggravated Assault. The accused remains scheduled to appear in Morden Provincial Court on February 23rd.

January 19, 2016

Police received information regarding a historical sexual assault that took place in the community many years ago. Police continue to investigate this allegation.

Police received a complaint of a lost / stolen wallet that went missing January 14th. The victim then reported that an empty envelope deposit was made to his bank account on January 16th and the suspect withdrew a large sum of cash using his personal bank card. Police obtained video from the banking institution and continue to investigate.

The entire incident was recorded on the video system installed on the outside of the bus.

A reminder when the lights are activated you are required to stop and remain stopped until the driver has deactivated the lights.

Police received a call about a lost engagement ring that was lost somewhere in the community about 3 weeks ago. Ring described as a round blossom design with a large round diamond. If anyone has found this engagement ring please call Morden Police Service (204)822-4900 so we can return it to the owner.

January 24, 2016

Police received several calls during the early morning hours regarding an assault that was occurring outside Tim Hortons. Several people had been punched by an accused later identified as a 22 year old male resident of Winkler. Police attended and located the accused who was heavily intoxicated. He was arrested for Assault Cause Bodily Harm and being intoxicated. Ambulance attended and provided medical attention to the victims. The incident had apparently started

outside Rock's Bar at closing with the accused then attending to Tim Horton's where it appears he began randomly assaulting people while unprovoked. The accused was released the next morning with documents to attend court in Morden February 23, 2016. Police continue to investigate obtaining statements and surveillance video. Further investigation will determine the possibility of further and more serious charges.

This past week there appeared to be a spike in residents receiving calls about owing back taxes to the Canada Revenue Agency. Residents are reminded Canada Revenue Agency will not phone you regarding owing back taxes. They will initially contact you by mail. If you receive a call like this please hang up immediately. If you continue to engage in conversation with these people they will continue to call and harass you. You can register your complaint with the Anti Fraud Centre at www.canadianantifraud.ca

Protect yourself

- Do not take immediate action. Verify that what you are being told is the truth.
- Ask yourself why the CRA would be asking for personal information over the phone or email that they likely already have on file for you as a taxpayer.
- Contact the CRA to confirm that you owe back taxes, or are entitled to a refund, before providing any personal or banking information.

Provide that information only when you initiate the call to the CRA.
