**4.0 Chief's Report**

- A. Chief Neduzak report that this summer has been extremely busy with a project the Service has been working on. Some foot and bike patrols were done and they will continue to be done as time and weather allows.
- B. Morden Police Service has been working on Project Denver which resulted in several arrests this summer. This project took approximately one year. Two officers were taken off their normal schedule and were seconded to this project.
- C. One officer was also on medical leave. This made for a busy year for other officers, however there was little to no overtime needed to replace this member during their leave.
- D. Morden Police Service, along with Winkler and Altona Police Services, are in the process of developing a Warrant Entry Team. This team will consist of members specifically trained to properly enter houses in a potentially volatile situation. Members will have to go through interviews, psychic evaluation, firearms training etc. to qualify to be on the team.
- E. Chief Neduzak reported on the budget for this quarter. Fines are up due to MPI funded programs such as Distracted Driving Check Stop, School Zone Check Stop etc. Cost recovery

is also up. This comes from things like Criminal Record Checks and Fingerprints. Police K9 revenue is also up. As far as expenses, salary is down. This is due to the one member that was away on medical leave. Automobile expenses are up slightly.

#### **5.0 Issues from the Public**

Pastor Mal Wagner from the Church of God thanked police for what they do. He said this summer had been a rough one due to a suicide and then another house death a few weeks later. He spoke on how he knows from the counseling side how this has impacted the families involved. Officers all handled themselves in an extremely professional way for which the families were grateful for.

Pastor Wagner also wanted to extend an invitation to Chief Neduzak to speak to the church staff. They often have members of the community come and speak on their role in the community. Pastor Wagner will be in contact with Chief Neduzak regarding this.
